Lunches

Lunches will be at the expense of the Organising Committee from 14/12/01 to 16/12//01. Lunches may be obtained using the *tickets* provided by the Organising Committee.

IV.2. GROOMS

Cost of the accommodation will be at the expense of the riders. Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the O.C. Each foreign invited rider will have the right to bring a groom who will receive a diet of 12.000 pts (48 Euros) for the whole show, taking charge of their own feeding expenses.

IV.3. HORSES

Maximum THREE per rider.

The Organising Committee will take care of the lodging of the competing horses, from 12/12/01 at 12:00 p.m. to 18/12/01 at 12:00 p.m.

The horses are only allowed to participate in one competition per day.

IV.4. WELCOME

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the O.C. in order to facilitate them on arrival.

IV.5. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON COMPETITORS AND HORSES (ART. 139.1.,2.)

Competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 139.1,2.

Inscription fees per horse are of **60.000 ptas.(360.61 Euros)** for all the event independently of the number of competitions and prizes in which they will participate. The riders and horses inscription for the first day competition should be made together with the definitive entry.

VI CUSTOM'S FORMALITIES

Horses coming from an E.U. country will not need any specific licence to enter Spanish territory, except for a valid veterinary certificate and an internal transport certificate.

Horses coming from other countries will need an A.T.A. certificate, given by the Chamber of Commerce of their respective countries. The means of transport, the arrivals and departures, including day and time of arrival to the frontier and to San Sebastian, will have to be notified to the official Custom Agents of the CSI.

VII VETERINARY MATTERS (Art.290.1004.2. 1005.2.2 +2.3,1011,1022.1)

VII.1. VETERINARY INSPECTION AND PASSPORT CONTROL

Will take place according to the FEI Veterinary Regulations Art.1011 and the F.E.I rules for Jumping Competitions, appendix X. This inspection will take place at **16:00** on **December the 13th**.

In accordance with Art. 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CSNs, CSIs Cat. C and CSI J.Y.P.Ch. Vs Cat. B in a foreign country, and all horses entered for CSI s Cat. A & B and CSI J.Y.Ch. Vs Cat. A, CSIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, wether at home or in foreign countries, must have a valid official FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

«The horses participating in a CSNs, CSIs/C and CSIs/JYP-B, in their own country, not need the above mentioned passport. All horses have to be correctly registered and identifiable by diagram. In case that the vaccine against influenza is not compulsory in their country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccine certificate.»

VII.2. VACCINE AGAINST INFLUENZA, ANEXO VI (Vet. Reg.)

All horses with a FEI or FEI validated national passport, must have their «Vaccine page» stamped by a veterinary who is not the owner of the horse. This stamp certifies that the horse has been administered two vaccines against influenza, in a lapse of time of a minimum of 21 days and a maximum of 92 days.

It is also compulsory to revaccinate in the course of 12 months from the second vaccine.

None of these vaccines should be given during the seven days preceding the event, including the day of the event or of the arrival to the stables of the show.

The above mentioned regulations, are the minimum required for the first vaccine as for the booster, so it is recommended to follow the laboratory instructions which correspond to the rules edited by the FEI in many cases. It is compulsory to administrate the vaccines in intervals inferior to 12 months.

VII.3. SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet Regs Chap V&VI and App. III)

Special guidelines are applicable for events by the FEI's Medication Control Program (Groups I and II only). At all other international events horses are subject to sampling for Prohibited Substances. Such sampling is compulsory in CSIs Category A, CSIOs, World Cup Qualifiers, Cup Finals, Championships and Games, and is recommended for other CSIs.

VII.4. RECOGNIZED LABORATORIES

According to the actual Medication Control Programme for Groups I and II (Western Europe) all samples will be analysed according to Art. 1017.1 of the Veterinary Regulations, for:

For the other cases, analysis of the samples can be done in any laboratory recognised by the FEI.

VII.5. PROGRAMME OF MEDICATION CONTROL

The participants in CSIS, CHF, Championships and Olympic Games, will have to pay the equivalent of **12.50 Sfr** per horse and show, to the Organising Committee, as their participation in the expenses in the elaboration of the program.

VII.6. SANITARY CONDMONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF HORSES

The horses must be in possession of the following documents:

VIII OTHER MATTERS

VIII.1. COMPLAINTS

For a claim to be official, it must be in written form and accompanied by the amount of 150,00 Sfr.

VIII.2. PRIZES

The distribution of prizes, trophies, ribbons, etc. will take place at the end of every Competition.

For the prize giving ceremony, the **FIRST FIVE PLACED Riders** will enter the arena riding their horses.

The riders are obliged to follow the indications given by the Event Director and offer their collaboration.

Prize money will be given at the end of the show in the event's office.

VIII.3. DOCTOR, VETERINARY AND FARRIER

Services given by the doctor, veterinary and farrier, will be at the expense of the rider, owner or person responsible for the horses.

VIII.4. INSURANCE

All participants must make sure that their personal insurance for third party responsibilities, accidents, illness, etc. are valid.

- For the activity performed.
- For the country in which the activity is performed.

In the case of a competitor's insurance not being valid, he will not be covered by the third party responsibility of the Organiser.

On the other hand, the horses, the material or the tack of the riders, remain totally under their responsibility and custody during all the show.

All the repatriation costs caused by an accident will remain under the responsibility of the participant.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The Organising Committee and its officials are not responsible for material and corporal damages caused by accidents of the participants, the horses or employees. Including the damages to vehicles, belongings, tack and stable accessories and other objects (including thefts, losses, fire, floods and other accidents).

As a consequence, the participants renounce to any legal procedure against the organiser.

VIII.5. SHOW ORGANIZATION

Under exceptional circumstances and with the rider's and Ground Jury's approval, the Organising Committee reserves the right of changing the Program, so as to give a solution to possible problems caused by an omission or by unforeseen circumstances.

These modifications will be notified as soon as possible to all riders, Jury and to the FEI General Secretary, via the Foreign Judge.

VIII.6. ACCESS PASS

Participating riders: TWO per rider.
Owners: TWO per competing horse.
Grooms: ONE per participating rider.

There will be different access passes that will allow entrance to the different areas of the show.

VIII.7. PRIZES AND TAXES

Prize money will be paid in Spanish currency at the Show Office after the last Competition.

In accordance with the Spanish Income Tax Law, the Organising Committee will retain the percentage, established by the law, over the amount of their prizes. The percentage changes depending on the riders nationality, according to the international agreements between Spain and the different countries.

The VAT (16%) is included in all the quantities that figure in this program as prizes. For further information the rider may contact:

IX. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Riders wishing to school during speed Competitions must inform the Organising Committee before these Competitions begin. These riders will start first in these Competitions.

X. FEI CONDUCT CODE

In all equestrian sports, the horse is king.

The welfare of the horse must prevail over the requirement of owners, teachers, riders, sponsors and Jury.

All veterinary attention and treatments provided to the horses must assure their health and welfare.

At all moments, a good level of health, hygiene, and diet of the horse must be maintained.

During transportation a good hygienic level must be maintained. Appropriate measures must be adopted to provide for a good ventilation, food and water supply.

Special interest must be given in trying to obtain a higher level in the coaching and practice of equestrian sports, as well as in providing scientific studies on equine medicine.

On the horses' behalf, the health and ability of the rider are considered essential.

In all horse show events and training methods, the horse must be considered as a living being, excluding all technique considered abusive by the FEI.

All National Federations must assure adequate controls, so that every person and authority under their jurisdiction, respect the welfare of the horse.

The National and International Rules of Equestrian Sports regarding the horses protection, must be respected, not only during the International and National Shows, but also during the training. The regulations must be constantly revised, so as to assure the respect de the horse.
